From Dawn's Desk

As 2012 begins, I wish you all a blessed New Year. The New Year begins with merriment and expectation, resolution and hopefulness, but liturgically the days following Epiphany, January 6, are referred to as Ordinary time.

Ordinary time literally means "ordinal" or "counted" time between the major seasons of the Christian Calendar – Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. Ordinary time is not a time of fasting or feasting; yet it is a daily time of giving witness to God's grace in your life and discerning God's purposes for your life. Psalm 90:12 speaks to me of Ordinary time: So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart.



In Ordinary time, it matters how we live our time. I once heard a good news/bad news saying: The bad news is that time flies. The good news is that you are the pilot. It is good to remember that we don't control time, but we are the pilots of our time responsible for what we do with our time.

God of our life, through all the circling years, we trust in you.

In all the past, through all our hopes and fears, your care shines through.

With each new day, when morning lifts the veil,

We own your mercies, God, which never fail.


