From Dawn's Desk

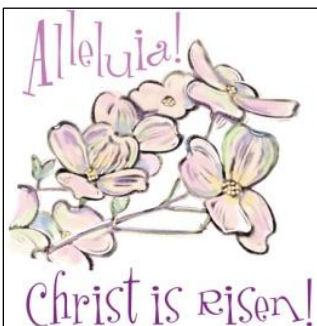
It's a given: good communication enhances community, and good communication requires mutual participation. As the new ministries begin their work, we reviewed the "Covenant for Christian Communication" written by the Rev. Stephen Washburn based on Matthew 18:15-17, 21-22 and Ephesians 4:15.

1. When we hear something that raises concerns for us, we shall first make every effort to speak directly, one-to-one with the person involved. A deacon or the pastor(s) may be asked to coach us in advance, or to be present to witness communication as Jesus specifies at step two of the Matthew 18 process. If talking one-to-one with one or two others fails, then concerns may be referred to the relevant group in the church or as a last resort the whole congregation.
2. In order to speak truth in love, we shall speak for ourselves using "I" statements, not claim to represent others or use accusatory "you" statements.
3. When difficult subjects need to be named, we shall pray for all concerned and seek guidance of the deacons and pastor(s) for help in speaking truth in love.
4. We accept that understanding and respecting each other does *not* necessarily mean agreeing with each other.
5. We affirm that the Holy Spirit may speak through any of us, so that all of us deserve a respectful hearing, even though congregational decisions are made by majority vote.
6. While all people are welcome in Christian communities, behavior that is unchristian (for example: threatening, taunting, demeaning, harassing or attacking) conflicts with Christ's teaching and will not be tolerated.



Through the *Chronicle*, *Brookside Bridge*, *Facebook*, the Sunday bulletin insert, and now the whiteboard in the narthex, in addition to Sunday announcements, we are trying to get the word out, so please give some attention to the communications. I realize how frazzled life can feel and how busy we can become, but please respond to communications. Nothing is more disheartening than to hear, "I wish I had known about that." Or when trying to plan transportation for an event and no one responds to an email leaving the planners to either have to call individually or guess who is coming. Communication needs a receiver, as well as an initiator. Part of being a community of respect for one another is both speaking and listening, giving and receiving, sharing and responding.

Lent 2012: "Who Do You Say I Am?"

Jesus asked this question of his first disciples. And, it is a question asked of disciples throughout the ages, *Who Do You Say I Am?* Peter answered, "You are the Messiah (Christ in Greek)." It is upon that rock (confession) that the Church is built. During Lent we will explore how the Church has responded to this question through a sermon series based on some of the titles of Jesus found in the four Gospels:

- Son of Man – Mark 8:27-38
- Rabbi, Teacher – Mark 9:2-9, 10:17
- I am the way, the truth, and the life – John 14:1-7
- Messiah, Christ – Matthew 16:13-23
- Son of God – Mark 15:33-39
- Savior – Mark 11:1-10, John 3:16-17

On **Wednesday** evenings at 7:15, **February 22-March 28**, we will have the opportunity to give our own responses. How would you answer Jesus? Has your understanding of Jesus changed? How would you tell the story of Jesus to others? Through art images, video clips, and an experiential model of learning, *Experiencing Jesus*, participants will rediscover what Jesus means to them and how they would respond to Jesus' question. The curriculum is based on the book, *Jesus: Uncovering the Life, Teachings, and Relevance of a Religious Revolutionary*, by Marcus Borg. Participants do not need to purchase the book. They will receive a participant's booklet.

Looking Ahead to Holy Week and Easter

April 1, Palm Sunday

- 10 am, Worship Service; Communion and Passion Story
(We'll gather on the front steps after worship for the 12th annual all-church Palm Sunday photo.)

April 5, Maundy Thursday

- 5:30 pm, Seder Meal in Fellowship Hall. There is no cost to attend, but please remember your food donation(s) for Lenten Loaves & Fishes.
- 7 pm, Service of Holy Communion and Tenebrae in the Sanctuary. Tenebrae is a very moving service of scripture readings accompanied by the gradual extinguishing of lights. The readings commemorate the events of the final three days of Jesus' life and death. When the sanctuary is in total darkness, it reminds the worshippers of Jesus' time in the tomb before his resurrection. At the end of the service, one candle is lit as the sign of Easter hope, and the congregation leaves quietly.



April 6, Good Friday

- 7 pm, Chapel: a service of prayer and reflection on the seven last words Jesus spoke from the cross.

April 8, Easter Sunday

- 6:00 am Sunrise Service on the Manning House Lawn
- 8:00-9:15 am Easter Breakfast in Fellowship Hall (\$5 per person, \$15 family maximum; purchase tickets in advance or at the door)
- 10:00 am Easter Worship Service in the Sanctuary, with Choir and the Nottingham Brass
- 11:30 am Brookside Family Easter Egg Hunt for ages 7 and under, Manning House Lawn

Keeping Up with What Our Children Are Learning at Church School

☞ In the month of February we had four workshops on the story of Jesus healing the man beside the pool. For the first two weeks we combined the kindergartens and first graders with the 3 and 4 year olds, and the second grade through seventh grade. In those weeks the children had science with Ellen Tourigny and games with Meg Brockett. The last two weeks of February we had one multiage class each week; Scott Milne taught a storytelling workshop and Melody Witcher taught a music workshop.

Many thanks to Ellen, Meg, Scott and Melody for teaching this unit.

☞ In **March** we will be starting with a multiage workshop on the 4th. This unit is “Who is Jesus?” using scripture from Matthew 16:13 -17. This is the story of when Jesus asks his disciples who people say he is, then he asks, who do you say that I am, and Peter answers, “You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.” The children will be discovering the meaning of the word Messiah. They will be given the opportunity to explore other titles of Jesus and who Jesus is to them.

This unit follows along with Pastor Dawn’s sermons centering around the names and titles we use when we talk about who Jesus is.

The workshops will be going through **April 1, Palm Sunday**. There will not be any workshops on Easter Sunday, but child care will be available for ages 5 and under. There will be an Easter Egg hunt after worship on Easter Sunday morning. Watch for details in the April *Chronicle* and the bulletin.

Confirmation Class Heading down the Home Stretch

In March, we will meet three times, as follows:

- **March 11:** Jesus’ Journey through Holy Week
- **March 18:** Resurrection and Eternal Life
- **March 25:** The Faith Journey Continues – what we believe and how we live it

We meet at 11:30 am in the Youth Lounge as we continue on our path to Confirmation, which will take place on **April 15**.

Illness prevented some other children from attending. 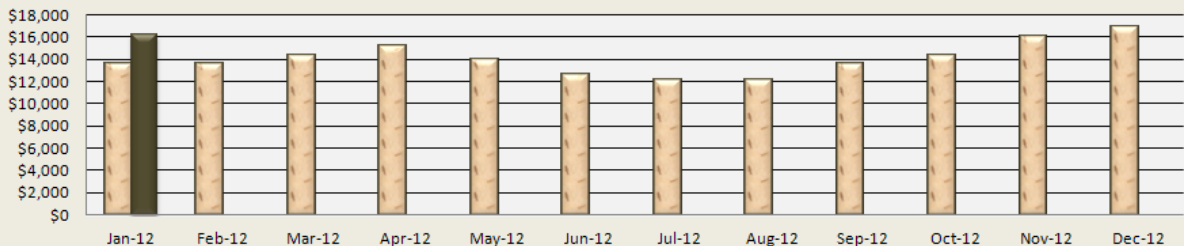
