## ***From Dawn's Desk – Ways We Walk with God***

Our response each week to our theme *Ways We Walk with God* has enriched our worship of God as we identified goals for the year, tried some new things in worship, like the Service of Blessing, and continue to plumb the depths of what it means personally and, as Brookside, to walk together in all God's ways.

In this month's newsletter, I will share some of the responses received from the congregation to our envisioning session on September 16 during worship. Thank you to Dale Trombley, Church Clerk, for ably recording and categorizing the responses.

In response to *What have we done at Brookside that has truly engaged and excited you?*, the following were mentioned: the music and all aspects of involvement with the music, being part of the current church school programs and children's enthusiasm, youth mission trips and programs, discussion groups, the generosity that Brookside provides by allowing our facility to be used by so many groups, the Thrift Shop, sponsoring and assisting Granite Pathways – a true demonstration of courage, and sermons. These were mentioned several times by different people.

*Where is it we've never been that you would like us to go?* A common theme was to work together as a church on a big fundraiser and to work together in a major mission effort that involved our participation, not just giving money. Some specifics included: raising food for Thanksgiving baskets, discover ways of helping homeless in Manchester, disaster relief, working with the inner city of Manchester and refugee community, all-church retreat, a church-wide mission activity, all-church mission trip, organizing regular exchanges with the Sakubva Church in Zimbabwe, vacation Bible school, church fair involve the whole church, coordination of Thrift Shop, Women's Union, and mission ministry into one functioning group. Other ideas focused on opening Manning House to plays and other events and a huge yard sale in the parking lot to benefit a mission. Each idea had the underlying hope of gathering people together and truly walking and working together for one goal.

The detailed list is available to anyone upon request and is displayed on the bulletin board in the office hallway. The Church Council has reviewed it, and the Long Range Planning Committee is reviewing it. The Long Range Planning Committee has been meeting since August and made its first report to the Church Council in October. The goal is to present their ideas at Annual Meeting in January to address the on-going sustainability of our facility. The committee is charged to:

- Develop a plan for the long-term use of the facilities of Brookside Church.
  - The Plan must maintain the mission of Brookside.
  - The Plan must create financial sustainability of the facilities.
  - Primary Goal - Tenant replacement for Granite Pathways when they outgrow the Carriage House.
  - Secondary Goal – Expansion of Brookside market offering for overall facilities use.
- Listen to the dreams of the congregation in programming and mission and develop long range goals for our ministry and mission – building on our assets.

Members of the committee are Calley Milne, chairperson, Judi Mitchell, Gail Goodman, Bobby Boisvert, and Mark Watts. They have been working creatively and diligently to help Brookside look to the future in new ways.

## ***Children Learn about Living Stewardship***

During October and November, the children have been learning about "Living Stewardship." There are five workshops: Art with Donna Molony, Cooking with Bob Boisvert, Drama with Bob Falco, Games with Megan Cleary and Science with Suzanne and Michael Pyszka. There will be a multi-age workshop on **November 11** (Veterans' Day weekend). We hope the weather will agree with our plans to have an outdoor project for the children to participate in.

Living stewardship is a way of life expressed in gratitude. It is a practice that involves all that it means to live as faithful followers of Jesus Christ. The organ is in desperate need of repair and you can help by purchasing a wreath for the upcoming holiday season. Christmas wreaths will be provided by the Three Rivers Wreath Company located in Franklin, NH. The wreaths are made with florist quality balsam that is picked fresh daily. Each wreath is handcrafted and inspected to be sure it is premium quality. You may choose a 22" plain or decorated wreath. The decorated wreaths may also be direct-shipped anywhere in the country. Consider purchasing a wreath for your door or send one as a gift. The decorated wreath will have 3 natural pinecone clusters, 2 clusters of red holly berries and a 6 loop, brick red, velvet bow. Direct-ship wreaths will arrive at the recipient's door on the selected ship date with a customized greeting card. Wreaths will begin shipping on November 20th.

### **Thanks for Help Given:**

1. *Religious Response to Hunger* ~ Many thanks to those who contributed to Brookside's participation in this year's Religious Response to Hunger interfaith offering of nonperishable food gathered by communities of faith within the Manchester area. Citywide, a total of 492 bags of groceries was collected and carried by caravan to New Horizons soup kitchen and food pantry.

2. *Soup-er Job!* ~ Many thanks to those who participated in the Empty Bowls soup fundraiser. Over 400 people attended on September 30, raising \$8,700 for New Horizons.

3. *Neighbors in Need* ~ Our October participation in Neighbors in Need, one of 4 special mission offerings of the United Church of Christ, provided \$233 in support of UCC ministries of compassion and justice throughout the United States.

### **Baskets Make Holidays Special for Recipients**

For over three decades the congregation of Brookside Church has participated in providing special food baskets at Thanksgiving and Christmas time for people in need within the Manchester area. Over the years we have worked in cooperation with community agencies to address issues of hunger, with an offering of 65-75 baskets each holiday.

This year Mission Ministry will be trying something a little different, and work toward a combined collection goal of serving 140 families during the fall/winter holidays of Thanksgiving and Christmas. Brookside members will have the opportunity to contribute bulk food items or the money needed to purchase such items. A new opportunity will also be available where you may choose to provide the items needed to fill a basket for one specific family. Food collection will begin on **Sunday, October 28** and continue through **Sunday, November 25**. Decisions about the potential for meeting our goal for Christmas will be decided Monday afternoon, **November 26**.

Food items needed for our holiday baskets include: Potatoes, fresh carrots, canned vegetables, stuffing, gravy, apples, cookies, hot cocoa, stick margarine, and of course, turkeys (we typically purchase turkeys in bulk as Brookside does not have the freezer space to be able to keep donated turkeys).

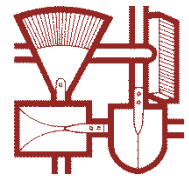

## Financial Update, In a Nutshell...

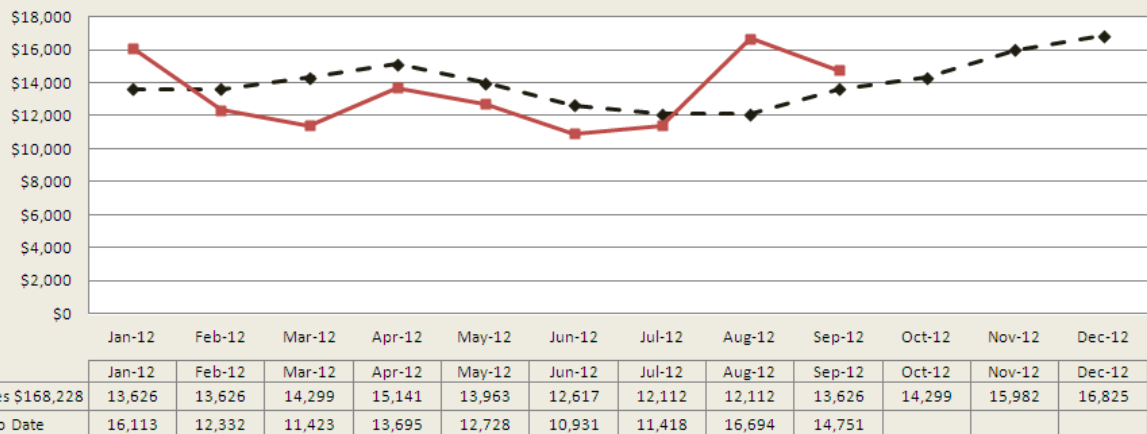
