Horton Center: The NH Conference's Summer Camping Program

After having been closed last year for re-visioning, repairs and re-staffing, Horton Center on Pine Mountain near Gorham, NH is reopening for summer camping this year!

Here's what the Rev. Mollie Landers, Associate Director of Outdoor Ministries, has to say on the website accessed through www.nhcucc.org or directly at www.hortoncenter.org:

We've spruced up the physical site, changed some public trails, and had some time to reflect on the future direction of Horton Center. Everyone is welcome at Horton Center, but this is a ministry of the New Hampshire Conference, which is comprised of local churches. This profoundly beautiful place belongs to us all. We're partnering with pastors, lay leaders, and parents to reaffirm this ministry as an extension of your spiritual home. There are some great things about Horton Center's history that we are retaining, but we've revisited boundaries and camping industry standards – and the program and purpose of the New Hampshire Outdoor Ministries is once again grounded in the mission of your church. We are partners in ministry!

I have taken church youth to Horton Center for many years while I served as Pastor with Boscawen Congregational Church, United Church of Christ in the 80's and 90's. In fact, in addition to my son, one of my campers is now my daughter-in-law Jennifer. I have fond memories of climbing to worship on Chapel Rock, meeting new friends from other churches in the Conference, having time to reflect on my faith, and enjoying the energy and enthusiasm of the campers. Nathan continued into High School as a camper participating in the hiking camps. When Jennifer and Nathan became a couple, one of the hikes we took was up to Chapel Rock. Their picture is in my office.

I did not know until recently that Kelley Guimont and Kim MacPhail have been Horton Center Campers from Brookside for years. This year they are Seniors, and unless they return as summer staff when they are in college, this will be their last year.

I would like to see Brookside Youth continue to participate in this wonderful opportunity for camp. I am so excited about the 2013 program *All Things New*, that I agreed to be a Dean for **July 31 – Aug. 3**, the Jr. Half Week for those going into 4th, 5th, and 6th grades. I would love to have some Brookside company as campers or adult counselors.

Registration is open. Information is around the church and on the website, but don't take too long to make up your mind because registration fills up fast! Associate Director Rev. Mollie Landers will be here **April 7** for worship.

March 28, Maundy Thursday

- 5:30 pm, Seder Meal in Fellowship Hall. There is no cost to attend, but please remember your food donation(s) for Lenten Loaves & Fishes.
- 7 pm, Service of Holy Communion and Tenebrae in the Sanctuary. Tenebrae is a very moving service of scripture readings accompanied by the gradual extinguishing of lights. The readings commemorate the events of the final three days of Jesus' life and death. When the sanctuary is in total darkness, it reminds the worshippers of Jesus' time in the tomb before his resurrection. At the end of the service, one candle is lit as the sign of Easter hope, and the congregation leaves quietly.



March 29, Good Friday

Walk with Jesus: With the endorsement of the deacons, we will offer a new, meditative Good Friday experience proposed by Gary Trahan. At 5:15 pm we will gather in Veterans Park to begin a walk to Brookside with some carrying a cross that Gary has built. Those who want to participate in carrying the cross some of the way should contact Gary by email at Gary Trahan [gareman2@aol.com] or sign up in the narthex. We will leave Veterans Park at 5:30 pm and walk in silence almost 3 miles to the church. Along the way, we will stop and offer prayers at certain places, and change cross bearers. We expect to arrive at the church by 7 pm for a brief Good Friday service open to walkers and non-walkers. If you are not able to walk, you can meet us at the church at 7 for the concluding service.

The youth groups have been busy these past few months!

Middle School: On January 12-13, three sixth-graders participated in the 30-Hour Famine, a fundraiser that brings awareness to world hunger through videos, food, games and other activities. Danielle Montoya, her cousin, Rachel Montoya, and Sara Dube worked together with Jean Dickson, Heath Auger and me to recreate lifestyles of children in Afghanistan. After walking to the local grocery store, we carried 10 half-gallon jugs of water back to Brookside Church to demonstrate to ourselves and others how difficult it is to live in a world where you must walk and carry water to drink, bathe, and wash dishes with. After Heath departed at lunchtime, we enjoyed a night filled with many activities and much conversation and laughter. We slept in the lounge in our sleeping bags, woke early, and ate breakfast in Fellowship Hall. At worship we spoke about our experiences to the congregation. These girls raised \$276 for world hunger and should be congratulated for their efforts.



High School: The high school youth had a busy January: first they participated on January 21st in the Day of Service at F.I.T. (Families In Transition), sorting clothing and hanging them to display in the thrift store. Then on January 29th, Alex Kivikoski, Matt Dube and Andrew Cleary served at New Horizons Soup Kitchen alongside Pastor Dawn Berry, Tom and Julie Cleary, Jean Dickson and myself. It was a cold night and there were many hungry folks who came in for a hot meal. I believe we served over 70 meals! On Saturday, February 2nd, the youth group served up pancakes, eggs and bacon at a fundraiser breakfast cooked by Kerry Richardson, Joe Lachance, and Robert

Tourigny. Many folks contributed muffins and other baked goodies to make this event a great success. We raised over \$300, bringing our fundraising to date to over \$2,700! Nice going, high school youth! Our efforts are being supplemented by a grant awarded to Brookside by the Conference on Congregational Life and the Strengthen the Church Fund for \$4,200! We are well on our way to funding the DOOR Mission Trip to Hollywood, California, and have paid our 2nd deposit for our 12 participants. Our next fundraiser will be a Corned Beef & Cabbage dinner being organized and prepared by the Kivikoski family, with help from the youth group. Cost for the meal is only \$8 (ages 12 & under – \$5), so save the date and wear your Irish green on **Sunday, March 17th**, from 11:30am to 2pm!

Thank you to everyone who has been helping the youth groups – we couldn't do it without the support and encouragement from church members and friends!

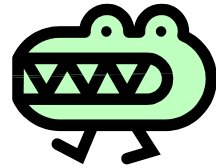

A Health Tip from the CMC Parish Nurse Office

Few of us look forward to a trip to the dentist, but did you know that your mouth is a mirror of your overall health? Aside from cavities, ill-fitting dentures, or the effects of some medications, studies have linked poor oral health and gum disease to inflammation occurring elsewhere in the body because bacteria travel through the blood affecting blood vessels and other organs. This inflammatory process is implicated in osteoporosis, rheumatoid arthritis, pneumonia, heart disease, stroke, diabetes, kidney disease, anemia, gastrointestinal disease, Alzheimer's, and other chronic diseases.



In all of these conditions, inflammation is the common link. Fortunately, though, this is often a two-way relationship and treating one condition often results in improvement of the other. Good oral health (brushing/flossing after meals and at bedtime and having regular dental check-ups) improves your quality of life. So the next time your dentist says "open wide," know that he/she is not just looking for cavities, but helping you to live better longer.

The training will start **Tuesday April 9**, from 6:00 to 8:30 pm and continue every **Tuesday** evening **through June 4** at the Visiting Nurse Association, 1070 Holt Ave., Manchester.

This comprehensive training program will equip participants with the necessary skills to provide non-medical aid and support to terminally ill individuals and their caregivers. Trained volunteers will work with the hospice team of health care professionals to provide emotional support, respite care, as well as grief and bereavement support to family members.

Any interested member of the community including homemakers, retirees, college students, professionals and couples who have the desire to provide such an important service are invited to explore Hospice Volunteering.
