For 14 years the Right Reverend Father Aurel Petrescu has served St. John of Suceava Church, the Romanian Orthodox Church that worships in the Brookside Chapel on Sunday mornings. And, for the last two years, Father Petrescu has lived in the cottage on Brookside property. Father Petrescu is being transferred to a Romanian Orthodox Church in Maryland, and will vacate the cottage by May 30.



I have enjoyed Father Petrescu. He is an empathetic priest, a caring colleague, and supporter of Brookside's mission. He also makes the best stuffed cabbage at Christmas which he generously shared with Greg and me. Our thoughts, prayers, and well wishes go with him as he moves to Maryland.

The question before Brookside is what to do with the cottage. Previous to being Father Petrescu's home, Pastoral Counseling Services had offices in the cottage, called Annex, for over seven years. And, before that, the Annex/cottage was the home of Brookside's sexton.

Well, we are coming full circle and the cottage will be the sexton's home once more. Beginning in June, Heath Auger, our sexton, and his wife Bobbie will take up residence in the Sexton's Cottage. Heath works 15 hours per week, and the cottage will be his home in exchange for his work.

This is a great outcome for both Brookside and the Augers, but we need to remember that Heath works 15 hours a week, not 24/7. So, please give the Augers their privacy by not knocking on their door to handle some church business and observing a wide perimeter around the cottage. Heath has an office and established hours, a phone extension at the church, and email. If you need something from the sexton call **669-2807 X105** or email sexton@brooksideecc.org, or come to the office during his work hours. It is to our advantage to have the Augers on the property, and Heath will be keeping an eye on the property; so let's respect the Augers' privacy in their new home. Welcome home, Bobbie and Heath!

H. S. Youth Were a Class Act in Hollywood

The mission trip to Hollywood was a great success this year, with ten high school students participating along with two parent chaperones. Brookside continues to support youth ministry through the DOOR program (Discovering Opportunities for Outreach and Reflection) which is headquartered in Denver, Colorado and provides direction and spiritual support for youth programs in six major cities across the U.S. Some of the activities that our youth participated in during April vacation this year were: ***Project Angel***--This was their first "mission" upon arrival in Hollywood. This organization provides meals for cancer patients, aids patients, and homeless in need. Over one thousand meals were prepared while our



group was on site. ***LA Foodbank***--The LA Foodbank was their second day and was the most physical of all. Our group sorted over 24,000 pounds of food that would be given to needy families later in the day. ***Homeboy & Homegirl Industries***--The Homeboy/Homegirl Industries works with gang members looking to get out of the gang lifestyle. The organization was started by a minister and has evolved into a large program over the years. They offer tattoo removal so that ex-gang members can remove gang-related art. For many of these young people, tattoo removal is a key part of re-entering society, allowing them to get decent jobs and creating a new identity for themselves. ***Presbyterian Church***--This was a very interesting and eye-opening day. The doors were opened at 11:00 am and we watched over 140 homeless people come to get their meal of the day. The youth got to see poverty, homelessness, and substance abuse close up. One of the assignments the youth were given was to engage in a conversation with someone utilizing the church. Our youth did a great job and everyone spent time talking to the homeless folks they were serving. ***Getty Museum and Blessed Sacrament***--The Getty Museum was both a fun day and exercise of mingling with a few homeless folks. We joined a group from the Blessed Sacrament (a program that provides support for homeless individuals) and took a tour of the breathtaking views and art offered at the museum. However, it was not just your normal visit to a museum. A few homeless people joined our group and it was our task to engage in conversation, enjoy the tour with someone homeless, and make new friends. This activity gave the youth the opportunity to see that homeless people are just like them but currently in a bad situation.

I hope that those of you who read this will also take the time to ask the youth and chaperones about their trip to Hollywood, California. My thanks to *Joe Lachance* for writing the daily summaries, and to *Donna Ferranti* for putting together the slide show for Children's Sunday. Not only do we have awesome youth, but we also have awesome youth group leaders! Although I'm sure that many remember the long hours and energy spent moving tables and chairs and cooking numerous meals in Fellowship Hall for fundraising events, it was all worthwhile to have it culminate in a wonderful mission trip full of memories and spiritual growth.
